Sarah is the founder and owner of Coupeville's Lavender Wind Farm and Shop. Her photography started when she was a kid with a brownie camera. She followed that with an art minor at the University of Denver in which she studied photography as well as painting, sculpture, and ceramics. She

never stopped taking pictures, but her confidence was ramped up after taking a couple of classes at the Pacific Northwest Art School with Keron Psillas.

"As much as I like people, I find real beauty is in the natural landscapes I encounter through working the fields, wandering around on pathways with friends, or just suddenly seeing something that is very ordinary in my own life in a new way. The question is: How do we convey as much of the breadth of the scene as we experience it? Color and light are invitations! Come play! Tell me a story!"
