12-4 PM: Demonstrations of weaving, beading, and other traditional crafts at the Fairgrounds in the Fiddle Faddle Farm Building.

5:00 PM: Seawall Park in Langley. Formal landing of the canoe with protocols.

**6:00 PM**, dinner provided by NCI: For the 3rd year, the NCI community has been invited to provide dinner for the canoe family and other Snohomish Tribal members on their arrival day. Sign up to volunteer to make soups, salads, bread, and desserts, or donate food for breakfasts and lunches. Other volunteer roles are available too. Sunday, July 7: 12:00 Noon: Community Potluck Meal and Salmon Bake followed by cultural sharing at the Fairgrounds. All are welcome to bring a potluck contribution and share in the meal. It will be followed by presentations, songs, dances, and other cultural gifts from both the Blue Heron Canoe Family and the Snohomish Tribe.

Mon-Thu, July 8-11: The Blue Heron Canoe Family invites everyone to visit their encampment throughout the week and participate in teachings, songs, craft-making, ceremony, and informal discussions. Feel free to take them a pot of soup, a loaf of bread, some cookies, or some garden produce, and stay to get to know them. The canoe family is offering to schedule some workshops and wants your input on activities and times. POSSIBLE WORKSHOPS include paddling the canoe (tide and wind dependent), wood burning, beading, nature observance, plant ID, native games, song/dance, and storytelling. 

It is gaining support but we need to encourage our representatives and Senators to co-sponsor it. The Earth Bill supports a comprehensive transition to renewable energy, requiring 100% renewable electricity, zero-emission vehicles, and regenerative agriculture by 2030.
